Due to the pandemic and to encourage more Alliance members to be involved in leadership positions, the Alliance is proposing two bylaw changes to be voted on during the 97th Annual Meeting on Saturday, April 2 in St. Louis. #### 127 A. General Eligibility:

- 128 1. To be eligible for nomination as president-elect, a member shall have served on the
- 129 Board of Directors for two (2) years.
- 130 2. To be eligible for nomination as secretary or treasurer, a member shall have served
- <sup>131</sup> on the Board of Directors for one (1) year. be a member in good standing.
- 132 3. All members in good standing shall be eligible for nomination as a Vice President.
- 133

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#### 253 Section 5. Regular Meetings

The Board of Directors shall meet in person or virtually no less than once a year. Notice of time, place and purpose of the meeting shall be given personally or mailed or electronically transmitted to each board member not less than ten (10) days before the

## Alliance Holiday Sharing Card – Great Success!

Perhaps because there was no opportunity to meet and support the Foundations at our usual annual meeting, which was cancelled due to the pandemic, donors to the Alliance Holiday Sharing Card fundraiser were particularly generous this year.

In November 2021, Gill Waltman spearheaded the Holiday Sharing Card project to raise funds for the Foundations. Proceeds from 41 donors amounted to \$4,295 to benefit the Foundations. This may be a record!

Donation checks for MSMF (\$4,270) were sent to MSMA headquarters and one check was mailed

## Alliance Match Day Program in its 27th Year

This is the 27th year the Alliance has celebrated Match Day in Missouri with your co-chairs Millie Bever and Angela Zylka.

The origin of the Match Day program began in St. Louis when Millie was made Alliance Medical Student/ Resident Spouse Liaison. She asked several people to join her committee. Roberta Goldman said she would help but only if we did something, and "she did not care if it was just a pizza party." So the first event we held were pizza parties at Saint Louis University and Washington University. This happened to be in February close to Match Day. They asked us to repeat the parties on Match Day which begins the week of March 14. Millie made contact with the University of Missouri - Columbia, however they wanted their party on the day the students find out if they match, which usually falls on the Monday of that week. It worked well for many years. Contact was made by Millie with University of Missouri - Kansas City, who also wanted to join the Match Day pizza program.

The Alliance has paid for the program in many ways for nearly the past three decades. Initially we had only the MSMAA budgeted amount. As we did more for the students, the local Alliances supported the programs with donations or money from fundraisers. The U.S. Army came in when recruiters came up to Millie at an Annual Meeting in St. Louis and asked if they could help her with any student event. This has turned out to be a long relationship as Dr. Grant Bever had been in the student program for the Army and knew many of the personnel. This expanded to Kansas City at the same time. Usually the military paid for pizzas in Kansas City and St. Louis. Later, sometimes we had help from the military for the University of Missouri - Columbia, with the Alliance hosting and supplying drinks, serviceware, snacks, and decorations. St. Louis held a fundraising theater event, organized by Angela Zylka who knew the owners of the theater, so more gifts and scholarships were given out. Currently, Washington University Match Day is now sponsored by a real estate firm with a lavish party at a clubtype setting. We still reach out to them, but they declined a pizza party. As the cost has escalated MSMA Alliance has increased the budget, and the St. Louis Metropolitan Medical Society has donated to student events.

This year on March 13-18, the University of Missouri-Columbia agreed to hold a pizza party during graduation week. Dr. Joseph and Donna Corrado will be hosting. This will be held outside of Student Affairs office on MU's campus from 11:00 am to 1:00 p.m. with more than 200 expected.

Due to the pandemic, the Match Days on March 18 at Saint Louis University and University of Missouri - Kansas City will be closed events, so the MSMAA is contributing.

At Kansas City University's Joplin campus there will be a Match Day pizza party on March 18 from 11:00 am to 1:00 p.m. with more than 175 expected at the Learning Center. MSMA and Alliance members attending are Dr. Alex and Barbara Hover, Millie Bever, Melody Burns, and Melissa Markham, assisted by the Learning Center staff.

At KCU's Kansas City campus, there will be an estimated 230 in attendance from 11:00 am to 1:00 p.m. on March 18. The Kansas City Medical Society will be represented by Dr. James DeRinna, Cheryl Douglas, and Dr. George and Sana Saleh. We are hoping to have monetary support from the military. The Match Day team from the school will also be assisting.

The Alliance receives lots of pleasure seeing our students enjoy the events and grow into fine young physicians. The MSMA MSS has grown from about 68 members to more than 1,000 members. The students have been acknowledged at the AMA, and now have reduced dues. At MSMA, MSS and RFS membership is free!

The Alliance coordinates fundraisers for the Missouri State Medical Foundation which gives scholarships to medical students in each of the eight schools of medicine campuses in Missouri. We are proud of our years of work, and we remember this is a state project that nearly every state Alliance member has worked, sponsored, or donated to. We love the students, who have now become doctors, one of which is mine from the University of Missouri -Columbia by way of Duke University back home to Kansas City.

This project was also held in 17 other states with help of the military. Many states, including Missouri, have been recognized by the AMA Alliance. It is a very good program as students remember the Alliance...well, maybe the pizza! **SMAN**


